

Benjamin R. Maginley, the well-known actor, died suddenly on the 3d ult. of consumption, at the home of his son-in-law, Mr. Frank Buckel, Jr., in the village of West Chester, Westchester county, N. Y. He had been suffering from throat trouble for over a year past, but his death was unexpected. Mr. Maginley, or "Uncle Ben" as he was familiarly called, was fifty-one years old, and was born in Marysville, Pa. For five years Mr. Maginley was a member of the Madison Square Theatre Company, playing with great success in "Esmeralda" as John Rogers, and as Tom Blossom in "May Blossom" with Georgie Cayvan. About three years ago he organized the "Inshavogue" company, buying the play from William J. Florence. He made a great hit as Deacon Crankett in the play of the same name, which ran for one hundred nights at the Union Square Theatre some years ago. He has also appeared in New York, with Dion Boucicault, in "The Shaughran," taking the part of Father Dolan. The "Inshavogue" company appeared in New York last Winter, at Jacob's and the People's Theatres. He closed his season at Utica a few weeks ago, and was engaged to open in Boston in August, in a new version of "Uncle Tom's Cabin."
